All our students make outstanding progress in their learning and achieve excellent outcomes	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Every student and every member of staff and Governor lives the Chesterton Ethos; and parents support the Ethos2. Every student behaves excellently, in lessons and outside lessons (see note 2 below)3. Students' attendance is outstanding; the College attendance target for 2011-12 is 96% and the Persistent Absence target is 3%4. The quality of teaching is satisfactory 100% of the time and good or outstanding 90% of the time5. The curriculum, including appropriate intervention, gives all students the opportunity to make at least two National Curriculum levels of progress by the end of Year 9 and at least 3 levels of progress overall by the end of Year 116. Every student achieves at least 5 A*-C grades or equivalent at GCSE and at least 75% of students achieve the 'Basics' measure (see note 3 below) at the end of Year 117. 'Student Voice' plays a significant part (see note 4 below) in the life of the College8. 'The Chesterton Challenge' ensures a minimum entitlement for all students. All students in Years 7 and 8, as of Sept 2011, and all future students, will complete the Challenge to at least Bronze level9. The College learning environment is clean, tidy, stimulating and fit for purpose
